LCC Reminds Students that Fall Registration Begins Soon

LANSING –Tuesday, June 21 is the first day of registration for fall semester at Lansing Community College. The semester begins on August 25.

LCC uses an assigned online registration system, with assigned dates according to the number of credits earned as of spring 2011.

Number of Credits Earned:	Register any time after:	Date:
60 or more	9:00 a.m.	June 21
30 or more	9:00 p.m.	June 21
12 or more	9:00 a.m.	June 22
1 or more	9:00 a.m.	June 23
All	9:00 a.m.	June 24

Registration for fall semester closes on August 23. The semester runs through December 18.

New students who plan to begin classes this fall must apply for admission by August 10 and are required to attend orientation.

The deadline for applying for financial aid is August 1.

Students are encouraged to follow these helpful steps before registering to simplify the process:

- Log into Banner to make sure your password has not expired. Verify that your current address and phone number are correct.
- If you are a first-time LCC student, you must apply for admission before you can register for classes.

- Settle up on any financial holds placed on your account that could prevent you from registering for classes. By making payments on time a student can avoid potential delays and frustration in the future.
- Make sure you meet the academic pre-requisites to allow you to enroll for the course(s) you wish to take.
- Keep an eye on your LCC student email for important updates and information about registration.
