FREE CERTIFIED NURSING ASSISTANT TRAINING AVAILABLE FROM LCC

LANSING, MI - Lansing Community College is offering free Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA) training to any individual who is eligible for Workforce Investment Act (WIA) Dislocated Worker services and is interested in pursuing a career in this field. Dislocated refers to anyone receiving unemployment benefits or has recently exhausted unemployment benefits. The training begins on Tuesday, April 19, 2011 and runs until May 31, 2011. The schedule for lecture and lab is Monday, Tuesday, Thursday from 1:30 p.m. -9:00 p.m. at Lansing Community College. Clinical instruction is Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday from May 18-31, 2011 from 3:00 p.m.-9:30 p.m. at Ingham County Medical Care Facility.

Potential students are required to attend an informational session at LCC, West Campus to determine WIA eligibility on March 3, 2011 from 3 p.m.-4 p.m. Work Keys and LCC placement tests are also used for participant screening. Participants selected for this training must take an additional 32-hour Employability Skills class offered at LCC, West Campus as part of this class. Selected students must also have a negative 2-step TB Skin Test prior to clinical experience.
